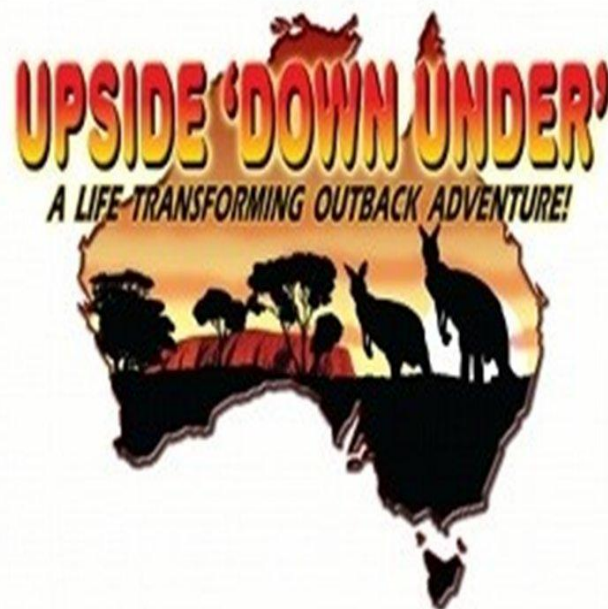

Helping the Tornado Victims

Last Wednesday, deadly tornadoes spun across the south destroying millions of dollars in property and killing more than 340 people. At this writing, there are more than 300 people still missing and authorities are using dogs to search for them.

Six college students hid in a closet of the Central Church of Christ in Tuscaloosa. One began praying the words "Dear Lord..." but was interrupted by the tornado. When the storm passed, the church building was completely destroyed but they were safe. Six families of this church lost their homes and four were briefly hospitalized with injuries. Last Sunday on May 2, the Central church assembled with the nearby Northport congregation in a joint worship service.

150 miles north in Athens, AL, twenty people were in the basement of the Bethel Church of Christ when their building was completely destroyed, but they too were spared.

At the conclusion of the Sunday morning service on May 15, a special contribution will be taken for tornado victims in Alabama. You may make your checks out to the White Bluff Church of Christ and we will send one check directly to the church in Tuscaloosa.

God willing in a couple of weeks, we want to send a work team from White Bluff into one of the stricken areas to help with clean-up. We are gathering information to determine what resources we will need to take with us (number of workers, tents, campers, generators, food, & water).

Pray for the victims. Help in whatever way you can. And pray that God will use this to bring many into the Kingdom of Jesus Christ.
