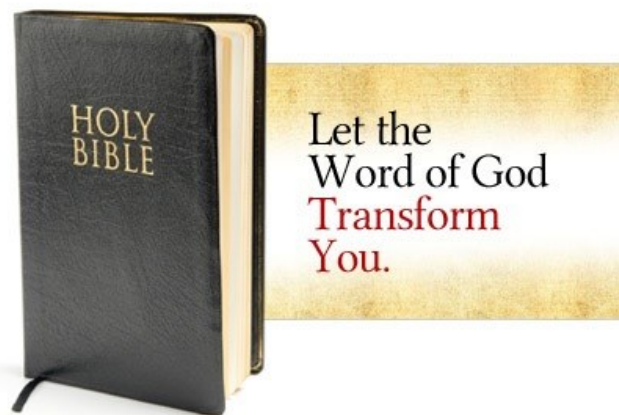
UKRAINE

The nation of Ukraine has been one of EEM's most successful areas of focus since the end of Communism. Over half of the public schools in Ukraine have EEM-sponsored Bibles, materials, and curricula. One of the current goals is to complete this process as soon as is practicable.

Ukraine is a large nation, about the same size as France. It has for centuries been considered to constitute the “border” between Europe to the west and the Russian world to the east. In fact, the name Ukraine means “borderland”. The founder and namesake of the Russian nation, Rus, came to rule what is now the Ukrainian capital city of Kiev in 1054. Many Russians have held the opinion that Ukraine is naturally theirs. (One of the titles of the former tsars, “Tsar of all the Russians”, includes Ukraine in its definition of a “Little Russia.) However, there is also a high degree of Ukrainian nationalism. Pro-Russian Ukrainians see their language as a dialect of Russian, but nationalists see it as a similar but separate language. Eastern Ukrainians are traditionally Eastern Orthodox, while many in the west are Catholic,

Interesting, the Lord's church had made its strongest inroads in the industrial Don basin in the east along the Russian border, one part of the country which has now been illegally invaded and annexed by the Russians. Reports from their say the brethren there are doing well, and are respected, in part because the New Testament teaches us to obey the authorities over us in all areas except matters of faith. Now there is more of a focus on the Western, European-oriented part of the country. Please help us to help these people with the truth of the Bible through your generous gift on Sunday, December 9th.
